He replaced the roof that was rotting, but doesn't know what's happening now. He would discuss idea with community to keep a balance between open space and function that would keep town's

charm. A member suggested to make it a sustainable growing facility similar to Nourish in Bridgeport. Another member suggested getting it on the national registry of historic places

What can be done about land assessments that lead to higher taxes?

Need to change zoning regulations. Now developers can build whatever they want as long as they comply with wetlands and site lines. Also work with developers and actually monitor the number of affordable units and who is living in them.

Will there be one new High School for all?

Probably not going to happen because there isn't enough space for a new high school.

Is there a way to streamline the process of doing business with the city?

That is something he wants to work on
